SPORTS TERMS:

Badminton:

- Mixed doubles: A match with two pairs of players, each consisting of a man and a woman.
- Deuce: A situation where the score is tied, requiring at least two consecutive points to win.
- Drop: A shot hit softly and with finesse, landing just over the net.
- Smash: A powerful overhead shot aimed to hit the shuttlecock downward into the opponent's court.
- Let: A situation where a rally is stopped and replayed, often due to a minor interference.
- Footwork: The movement and positioning of the feet during play.
- Setting: Skillful and precise placement of the shuttlecock.

Baseball:

- Pitcher: The player who throws the ball to the batter.
- Put out: An action that eliminates a batter or baserunner from the game.
- Strike: A legal pitch that the batter swings at and misses.
- Home: The final base that a player must reach to score a run.
- Bunt: A deliberately weak hit where the batter taps the ball a short distance.

Billiards:

- Cue: The stick used to strike the billiard balls.
- Jigger: A small bridge used for shots that are difficult to reach.
- Pot: To pocket a ball.
- Break: The opening shot of a game.
- In Baulk: A designated area on the billiards table.
- In Off: Potting a ball in a pocket.
- Cannons: A shot where the cue ball hits two other balls.

Boxing:

- Upper cut: An upward-angled punch.
- Round: Each segment of a boxing match.

- Punch: A forceful strike with the fist.
- Bout: A single match between two boxers.
- Knock down: When a boxer is knocked to the canvas.
- Hitting below the belt: A foul involving hitting the opponent in the groin area.
- Ring: The area where the match takes place.

Bridge:

- Finesse: A technique of playing a card in a way to maximize its potential.
- Dummy: The partner's hand, placed face up on the table.
- Revoke: Failure to follow suit when able.
- Grand Slam: Winning all tricks.
- Little Slam: Winning all but one trick.
- No Trump: A bid where no suit is specified.
- Rubber: A series of games.

Chess:

- Bishop: Chess piece that moves diagonally.
- Gambit: Sacrificing a pawn for strategic advantage.
- Checkmate: The position where the opponent's king is in check with no legal moves.
- Stalemate: A situation where a player has no legal moves.

Cricket:

- L.B.W. (leg before wicket): A method of dismissal.
- Creases: Markings on the pitch.
- Popping creases: Lines where batsmen are safe.
- Stumped: A method of dismissal by the wicketkeeper.
- Bye: Extra run scored without the ball hitting the bat.
- Leg-Bye: Extra run scored due to the ball hitting the batsman's body.
- Googly: A deceptive cricket delivery.
- Hat-trick: Taking three wickets in three consecutive deliveries.
- Maiden over: An over in which no runs are scored.

Football:

- Offside: A player being nearer to the opponent's goal line than both the ball and the second-to-last opponent.
- Block: An obstruction to prevent a player's movement.
- Drop-kick: A method of restarting play.
- Penalty-kick: A direct free-kick awarded after a foul.
- Corner-kick: A method of restarting play from a corner.
- Free-kick: A kick awarded after a foul.
- Dribble: Skillful ball control while running.
- Thrown-in: A method of restarting play by throwing the ball back onto the field.

- Foul: A breach of the rules.

Golf:

- Boggy: An area of wet, muddy ground on a golf course.
- Foursome: A game in which two players form a team, taking alternate shots.
- Stymie: A situation where a player's ball is blocked by an opponent's ball.
- Tee: The starting point for each hole.
- Put: A stroke to sink the ball into the hole.
- Hole: The target on the golf course.
- Niblic: A type of golf club.
- Caddie: A person who carries a golfer's clubs.
- Links: A type of golf course.
- The green: The area around the hole.
- Bunker: A sand trap.

Hockey:

- Carried: Holding the ball with the stick.
- Short Corner: A penalty corner.
- Bully: A method of restarting play.
- Sticks: The playing equipment.
- Offside: Being in the opponent's half of the field.
- Roll in: A method of restarting play.
- Striking Circle: The area in front of the goal.
- Under-cutting: A foul involving lifting the ball dangerously.
- Dribble: Skillful control of the ball.

Horse Racing:

- Jockey: The rider on a horse in a race.
- Punter: A person who bets on horse races.

Polo:

- Bunker: A method of restarting play.
- Chukker: A period of play.
- Mallet: The stick used to hit the ball.

Tennis:

- Backhand drive: A shot hit with the back of the hand facing the direction of the stroke.
- Volley: A shot made in the air before the ball bounces.
- Smash: A powerful overhead shot.
- Half-volley: A shot made just after the ball has bounced.
- Deuce: A tied score.
- Service: The act of serving the ball.

- Let: A situation requiring a replay.
- Grand Slam: Winning all four major tournaments.

OLYMPIC GAMES

- **Origins:**
 - Greek Games: First held in 776 B.C. on Mount Olympus in honor of Zeus.
 - Duration: Continued every four years until 394 A.D.
- **Modern Olympics:**
 - Founder: Baron Pierre de Coubertin initiated the modern Olympics in Athens in 1896.
 - Frequency: Held every four years, except during world wars.
- **Olympic Flag:**
 - Description: White flag with five colored rings, each symbolizing a continent.
 - The five interlaced rings are arranged in a 3-2 pattern on a white background, with the blue ring on the far left, followed by yellow, black, green, and red in the same order.

- The colors of the rings represent different continents: Blue for Europe, Black for Africa, Red for the Americas (North and South America), Yellow for Asia, and Green for Oceania (Australia and New Zealand).
- The official Olympic Motto is 'Citius, Altius, Fortius,' a Latin phrase meaning 'Swifter, Higher, Stronger.'
- The headquarters of the International Olympic Committee (IOC) is located in Lausanne, Switzerland.

- The 19th Asian Games are scheduled to be held in Hangzhou, China, in 2022.

- The first Commonwealth Games took place in 1930 in Hamilton, Canada.
- Since 1930, the games have been held every four years, except for 1942 and 1946 due to World War II.
- The Commonwealth Games Federation (CGF) is responsible for the direction and control of the Commonwealth Games.
- There are currently 54 members of the Commonwealth of Nations, and 71 teams participate in the games.

- The 21st Commonwealth Games were held in Gold Coast City, Queensland, Australia, in 2018.
- The 22nd Commonwealth Games are scheduled to be held in Birmingham, England, in 2022.
